### REG Grays Harbor biodiesel production nets record year

With 18 months of operations as Renewable Energy Group (REG) Grays Harbor, the 38 employees at the GH plant are celebrating setting new production records. The 100 million gallon per-year-capacity biorefinery produced 72.3 million gallons in 2016, a considerable increase in production over the previous record.

Since taking on the plant in August 2015, REG has invested more than \$5 million into the facility at the Port of Grays Harbor. One of the major investments was a new state-of-the-art decanter which helped improve the quality of glycerin, a co-product of the biodiesel making process. The glycerin is then piped aboard vessels at Terminal 1, the Port's dedicated liquid bulk

terminal, for export to China where it is refined for other uses. A new rail fall protection project was also recently completed which added fall protection to all five of REG's tracks to include all 64 rail loading and unloading locations.

"The increase in production and the increased vessel calls for glycerin export have helped put people to work in the plant and at our docks," explained Deputy Executive Director Leonard Barnes. "We look forward to working with REG as they continue to weigh options for a potential expansion and further investment in Grays Harbor."

REG owns and operates 14 active biorefineries throughout North America and Europe.
