Hesco Armor plates to protect US Customs and Border Protection

Coastal Innovation Zone tenant, Hesco Armor, Inc., will be providing Hard Armor plates to Armor Express, a leading U.S. manufacturer and distributor of high-performance body armor solutions, as part of a \$20 million five-year, indefinite delivery/indefinite quantity contract with U.S. Customs and Border Protection (CBP).

Hesco will manufacture ultralight weight torso and side plates that will protect CBP officers, which is the largest civilian law enforcement agency of the Department of Homeland Security charged with border management and security.

"Long-term contracts like this CBP award are an essential component of job stability and creating future workforce opportunities here at our Grays Harbor manufacturing facility," explained Hesco Chief Business Development Officer Joe Kawaky (pictured below with Hard Armor).

Hesco began operations in the Coastal Innovation Zone in 2012 and currently employs 30 full-time workers.

BHP seeks permits to construct potash export facility at Terminal 3



Only an hour and a half from open-ocean with over 150 acres of available uplands for development and access to both Class 1 railroads via the Puget Sound and Pacific Railroad, the Port of Grays Harbor's Terminal 3 in West Hoquiam is a prime location for a world-class potash export facility. And earlier this month, leading global resource company BHP, submitted its local, state and federal permit applications, along with comprehensive supporting environmental studies, to construct such a facility.

BHP would potentially construct a potash export facility in a phased approach to eventually handle up to 8 million tonnes per year. The potash would be mined and processed in Saskatchewan, Canada and transported to Terminal 3 via rail where it would be unloaded and stored in a fully

enclosed warehouse before being shipped overseas via bulk ocean-going vessels. BHP would also construct a new berth and shiploader adjacent to Terminal 3 as part of the proposed project.

"We are extremely excited for the potential investment, job creation and economic impacts this project will bring to our community," shared Port Commission President Jack Thompson. "BHP has demonstrated an impressive level of due diligence, community outreach and environmental stewardship. And while there are several permits and approvals needed from various local, state and federal agencies, we are optimistic they will be able to navigate the permitting process without delay."
