Wishkah River Distillery crafting hand sanitizer in response to COVID-19 shortage; available locally

Port of Grays Harbor tenant, Wishkah River Distillery, has begun making hand sanitizer instead of its signature whiskey, gin and vodka in response to the shortage that has been created by the COVID-19 pandemic.

Recognizing the shortage at his own drug stores and store shelves throughout the region, Distillery majority owner Pat O'Donnell inquired if producing hand sanitizer would be something they could do and now they are off and running.

Locally, Grays Harbor Transit, Coastal Harvest, Ocean Gold Seafood, and Timberland Bank have procured the sanitizer for their use.

Local consumers can also find the product at City Center Drug in Aberdeen and in limited supply at Wishkah River Distillery located at 2210 Port Industrial Road in Aberdeen, where they are also offering free refills for first responders.
